No one turned away for lack of funds

H.E. Kilung Jigme Rinpoche is the fifth incarnation of Jigme Ngotsar Gyatso an 18th century enlightened yogi and scholar, and one of the "Four Jigme's," heart sons of Rigdzin Jigme Lingpa, the promulgator of the Longchen Nyingtik tradition (Heart Essence of the Great Expanse). This path realized through Longchenpa has become the most famous and widely practiced cycle of Dzogchen teachings. Kilung Jigme Rinpoche teaches almost exclusively in this lineage.

Born in 1970 in Dzachuka, Kham in east Tibet, Rinpoche was discovered as a tulku in his youth and recognized by H.H. Dilgo Khyentse Rinpoche, H.H. Kyabje Minling Trichen Rinpoche, H.E. Dzogchen Rinpoche, and H.H. Dodrupchen Rinpoche.

Since the age of 17, Kilung Rinpoche has been the head of Kilung Monastery in Tibet and is reestablishing it as a center of learning and practice for the monks and nearby nuns. He also sponsors humanitarian projects for the nomadic people of Dzachuka, recently building a bridge that helps save lives of people and animals.

In 1998 Rinpoche began teaching Buddhism in the west and has a growing number of students throughout the world. Rinpoche presently resides on Whidbey Island where he is establishing a base; as well, he continues to spend time in Dzachuka where he guides his monastery, serves his community, and works to sustain the culture.
