


Modern New Facilities



Preserving Tibetan Buddhist Wisdom and Culture

Arising from the ashes of a devastating fire in 2016, the new Kilung Shedra (Buddhist monastic college), children's elementary school, and regional community center are under construction in the nomad region of Kham, East Tibet.

These new facilities will sustain and preserve Tibetan Buddhist wisdom and culture in its ancient homeland, while connecting the entire world to its enduring riches.



Dza Kilung Rinpoche is a lineage master of the Longchen Nyingtik tradition, head of the Kilung Monastery, and the Spiritual Leader of the Kilung Foundation.
